Archery	Want to try the exciting, challenging sport of Archery and learn some techniques. Even if you have never shot a bow or do not know much about archery, this is the workshop for you!
Breakfast in the Woods	Want to take your troop for an overnight? Learn by hands-on activities how you can prepare breakfast for your girls in the woods and have fun doing it. Bring your appetite and a mess kit (or plate and utensils). \$5.00 extra cost. Time: 8:00 a.m. to 9:50 a.m.
Ceremonies, Flag Etiquette and Museum Display	Artifacts from our Girl Scout Museum will be on display and the committee will present a program on Traditional Girl Scout Ceremonies and Flag Etiquette so you can learn, then teach your girls how to celebrate their special events throughout the year.
Clay Pot Creations	Clay pots are not just for planting. Come find out how to turn these into great party gifts, such as jars, wind chimes, party favors and more.
Come Play With Us	Learn games and team building activities that provide an opportunity for developing group cooperation, teamwork and self-confidence. Activities you can be used to fill in five minutes or fill an entire meeting.
Crafting and Older Scouts	The goal is to retain older girls interest in scouting. It's not just for the little ones. Ideas can used to complete senior badge "Textile Artist", "Room Make Over" or for silver/gold award workshops. Each participant needs to bring a used Girl Scout or other activity t-shirt.
Crocheting Mats for Homeless	Crochet a mat out of plastic bags. Must know how to crochet to take this workshop. Bring an "M" size crochet hook.
Embellished Notebooks	Embellished Notebooks are great. We will start with a standard composition notebook. Then we will create a fresh cover, binding, pockets, divider tabs, and even a ribbon bookmark. Through the years I have made these with the girls as their GS notebook (bring to all meetings). We have also created them for travel with sections for badge work, Journey work, expense/budget, and journal sections. You can use these for Novelist and Book Artist Badge. Bring your own composition notebook.
Fun With Food	Your mother may have said never play with your food but that is exactly what we are going to do. We will make edible projects great for gifts, community service project or to do just for fun!
Geocaching	This an outdoor recreational activity in which participants use a GPS receiver or mobile device and other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers called "geocaches" or "caches". There are millions of geocaches just waiting for you to find them. To get started, all you need to do is sign up for this workshop.
Healthy Meeting Snacks and Energizing Healthy Hiking Snacks	Learn quick and easy healthy snacks for your meetings and hikes - also a couple of allergy free, gluten free snacks you can offer the girls in your troops. Recipes included.
Journey in a Day and Summit Award	Do Journeys feel endless to you? Do you worry about boring the girls? Presentation of several successful quality Journeys in a day and brain storming on how to implement others.
Letter Boxing	A mix of hiking, puzzle solving, treasure hunting and rubber stamp artistry topped off with the thrill of discovery.
Low Ropes and Team Building	Develop communication and trust; build teams using physical and mental challenges that require group interaction.
Macramé for Beginners	Learn the basic knots used in macramé. With these knots, you can make key chains, bracelets, plant hangers and more!
Meal Planning for Troop Camping	You have booked the camp and now you have to feed your troop! We will give you suggestions and recipes for breakfast, lunch and dinner. We will demo equipment, help you make a box oven and give you a taste of apple cobbler baked in a Dutch Oven.
More Than A Walk	Exploring the outdoors on a hike is an amazing experience, but sometimes on a trail, nature needs a little help. Learn some of our favorite activities and games that will keep girls occupied as they walk along. We will give you suggestions on local day hikes and weather permitting explore Rock Hill.

Overnight Indoor Training	Learn the necessary steps for planning an overnight using an indoor facility with electricity, a kitchen and bathroom. This course must be completed prior to taking girls on an indoor overnight trip and a prerequisite for Overnight Outdoor Training (OOT)..
Paper Christmas Trees	Decorating with paper Christmas trees can be a beautiful and inexpensive way to create a festive holiday atmosphere. Learn how to make two different kinds of paper decorations. Excellent group project for children or adults.
Plastic Bottle Recycling Fun!	Recycle those plastic water bottles into interesting craft items. You must bring some clear plastic two liter and pint plastic bottles.
Poetically Speaking	Change the way you see and hear the world! Explore poetry creation through a variety of techniques. No pain! No experience needed! Unleash your creativity!
